<p>Media Arts</p> <p>Manipulate media representations to identify and examine social and cultural values and beliefs, including those of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples (ACAMAM074)</p> <p>Evaluate how technical and symbolic elements are manipulated in media artworks to create and challenge representations framed by media conventions, social beliefs and values for a range of audiences (ACAMAR078)</p>	<p>Historical Skills</p> <p>Identify and analyse the perspectives of people from the past (ACHHS190)</p> <p>Use chronological sequencing to demonstrate the relationship between events and developments in different periods and places (ACHHS164)</p>
