The Australian Centre For Contemporary Art has organised a video screening and lecture tour of Australia by Mr. John Hanhardt, Curator of Film and Video at the Whitney Museum of American Art, New York.

Mr. Hanhardt will be presenting "New American Video Art: An Historical Survey 1967 - 1980". This is a collection of video from the Whitney Museum which traces the history and forms of this new and exciting art form.

The Whitney Gallery has had a long involvement with the encouragement, distribution and exhibition of contemporary American video. Mr. Hanhardt is an internationally recognised expert in this field and apart from overseeing the Whitney collection of Film and Video sits on jury panels of many international Film and Video festivals and contributes essays and articles to journals in this field.

It has been sometime since a comprehensive selection of contemporary American Video has been shown in Australia. This is a most timely opportunity for Australian Film and Video makers to be informed first hand, by one of the leading experts in this field, of developing trends in America.

The fourteen (14) hours of videotape included in this collection will be on public display at the Australian Centre For Contemporary Art from Tuesday 12th August, 1986 thru Saturday 16th August, 1986.

On the Evening of Thursday 14th August, 1986 at 8.00 PM Mr. Hanhardt will present, at the Glasshouse Theatre, a public lecture illustrated with video and slides entitled "Video Art: Expanded Forms". This lecture is concerned with recent American Video Installation and Performance, a unique facet of Video Art, involving a multi-monitor presentations, closed circuit installations and performance. This enables artists to explore the sculptural, transmission and theatrical qualities of television and highlights the great differences between video and film, an area which is often confused and misinterpreted.

Mr Hanhardt's visit to Australia has been made possible by the generous support of the Australian Film Commission and the Visual Arts Board of the Australia Council.

To coincide with this tour, the ACCA has curated "Recent Australian Video Installations, a Video show featuring six of Australia's leading Video artists. Jill Scott, Phillip Brophy, John Gillies, David Chesworth, Leigh Hobba and Randelli will be presenting examples of their work and will show that Video is not just an American phenomenon, but is a truly international art movement and well-established in Australia.
