The Australian Centre for Contemporary Art is a public, non-commercial gallery which provides an annual programme of exhibitions and events focusing on recent developments in Australian and international, contemporary visual and performing art practices. The broad purpose of the Centre is to foster new developments in the visual arts and to expand public understanding and awareness of contemporary art.

There were 10 exhibitions during 1990 and 8 ancillary events including 5 exhibition forums, and lectures by visiting speakers, as well as 2 performances (1 experimental music and 1 experimental theatre) with a total attendance of 16,350.

The Centre became affiliated with Monash University in January 1991. The affiliation came about to ensure the continued existence of the Centre as an independent public gallery committed to the presentation of the best Australian and international contemporary art and to the development of public awareness and understanding of contemporary art issues.

The Centre is funded by the Victorian Ministry for the Arts, the Visual Arts/Craft Board of the Australia Council, private and corporate sponsorship, and membership dues.
