## Esensual Fragments inhabit me (like a memory): Neil Emmerson

EXHIBITION DATES: 26 MAY - 27 JUNE 1993 OPENING: TUESDAY 25 MAY 6 - 8 PM

Emmerson's concertina of lithographic screens project an erotic and theatrical visual experience. Theatricality and the human body are intimately related: for Emmerson they are one. It is his body that you are inhabiting: borders between the interior and the exterior Inhabit me (like a memory) is an invocation of an irresolute place where theatricality and flesh adhere in decidedly heterogeneous ways. This reconfiguration relates an understanding of the gay body as style.

The theatre/body rapprochement has a particular and sexually significant function in gay male culture. For gay men the theatricalisation of the body has been an historically powerful arena in which to unmake the sanctioned zones of the body and display them in ways which subvert the given assumptions between procreative sexuality and hetero-normality. Emmerson is not undressing and then cross-dressing the body. He is inventing it.
