Addressing the increasing separation of the rational from the spiritual in contemporary life, Marian Drew's images are a personal exploration of the self, the function of myth and the role of the intuitive in thought processes. The notion of play and humour as ways of experiencing the self underscores her filmed performance of whimsical and ritualised acts. She combines video and light projections and photography with collages of large drawings and wall paper to unite the gallery space with the artwork, and to surround the viewer with her images.
