They crawled out of the cyberswamp during a southern summer circa 1991 on a mission to hijack cowboy toys and remap cyberspace. The hype on the net is that the group plan to download direct to your cerebral cortex digital propaganda, soon, so sharpen your synapses...

VNS Matrix, who manifest as Josephine Starrs, Julianne Pearce, Francesca da Rimini and Virginia Barratt, are cyberfeminists with attitude, committed to redefining the role and image of women in art and technology. Based in Adelaide and Sydney, their ironic and witty art injects a critical edge into the arena of art and new technologies, imagining and imaging alternative future worlds.

For the Esensual Fragments project, VNS Matrix have designed a new image which will materialise at bus stops and other public sites around Melbourne during the month of August. This poster goes some way towards infiltrating the domain of private enterprise to offer new representations of women and technology.

VNS Matrix have attracted wide national and international attention for their current work. In particular, their development of an interactive computer game entitled **All New Gen** which is the antithesis of 'Gameboy' style games which have become rapidly embedded in popular (male youth) culture, has been controversial. **All New Gen** is 'Gamegirl' supported by her Zonegirls, the DNA Sluts. Her mission of sabotage is to act as a virus in cyberspace, infiltrating and corrupting the fathernet of power and ambition.
