John Conomos Night Sky

Exhibition dates: 18 August - 17 September 1995

NIGHT SKY is a playful and painful elaboration of the artist's identity, navigated between a 1950s Sydney milkbar and the Greek island of Cythera.

This autobiographical work by Sydney based artist John Conomos brings together personal memories and images of immigration with explorations of language and the power of text. Video monitors screen images reconstructing imaginary events and memories from the artist's bi-cultural childhood, combined with blue neon signs depicting fractured English words that are representative of post war migrant speech.

John Conomos is a media artist, critic and writer who is currently engaged in doing a major autobiographical/landscape video called *Autumn Song* and is writing a critical history of Australian video. He lectures at the Colleg of Fine Arts, University of New South Wales and is co-founding editor of the time-based arts journal *Scan*+. He spoke on interactive art at this year's Biennale of Ideas Symposium in Sydney.
