# WICE THEORY 3 PRACTICE

The chimerical veracity of video has determined its use in art as elsewhere. Video alternates between the poles of representation which is to say it runs the gamut of storytelling, capable of objective analysis as much as grand flictions.

Its proliferation as an art form requires some reflection on this peculiar capacity and some account of the opportunities it provides artists. The forums will incorporate historical, theoretical and practical analysis of video art illustrating the complexity and diversity of the medium.

Videor promotes video as a *practice* rather than a *technical* device. What is video's relationship to other modes of representation, related technologies and the cultural uses of those technologies? What role does video play in representation generally, particularly beyond its graphic or objective stereotype?

Videor comprises three interrelated forums. A key note international speaker will feature at a fourth event developed in association with the Australian Centre for Contemporary Art and the Melbourne International Festival for the Arts in October
