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## British Council-supported artists participating in the Melbourne International Biennial Signs of Life

<u>Amanda Dunsmore</u> is based in Belfast and works with installation and public art projects. She has exhibited in Germany, Poland, Iceland and the UK. Amanda is also a participant in STEM, a Belfast based performance group.

Mariele Neudecker is a London-based artist. She works between sculpture, installation and photography. She has exhibited at the Lunds, Konstall, Lurid, the Collective Gallery, Edinburgh and Whitechapel Gallery London. Mariele's solo exhibitions have been held in Middlesborough, Bristol and Berlin.

<u>Susan Philipsz</u> is based in Belfast and works with site-specific sound installation. She has exhibited in London, Belfast and Glasgow, and has had solo exhibitions in Manchester, Derry and Belfast.

<u>Joao Penalva</u> is based in London. His work for the Biennial is a film-installation. Joao has exhibited at the Institute of Contemporary Art, London, and in Oporto and Hiroshima. His solo exhibitions include those at the XXIII Bienal Internacional de Sao Paulo, Brazil, and in Lisbon and London.

<u>Chad McCail</u> is an Edinburgh-based artist. His work – drawings, prints, gouaches has been shown in exhibitions such as Surfacing, ICA London, Insulator in both London and Edinburgh. He has also held solo exhibitions in both London and Edinburgh.

Stephanie Stewart and Eddie Smith are based in Glasgow and work collaboratively with video and sound installation. They have exhibited in Lucerne, Berlin, New York, Edinburgh and Paris.

<u>Dan Shipsides</u> is based in Belfast and works with site-specific installation. He has been involved in numerous collaborative projects in Chicago, Toronto, Glasgow, Helsinki, and Belfast.

<u>Cornelia Parker</u> will be presenting a suspended piece made on site from chalk from a cliff fall retrieved from Beachy Head in England.

<u>Graham Gussin</u> is a London-based artist. He has been in exhibitions such as The Art Space Now, Tate Gallery. London, A Slip of the Mind, Centre Regional d'Art Contemporain Languedoc-Roussillon, The Tarantino Syndrome, in Berlin.

John Frankland is a London-based artist. He creates 'architectural' installations. He has recently exhibited in Amsterdam, Prague and London.
