

ACCA EDUCATION VENUE & SAFETY INFORMATION

Arrival and Departure

To find the best travel option to ACCA go to the VISIT section on our website. Coaches can drop students off outside ACCA on either Sturt Street or Dodds Street, and then return to pick them up at the end of the program. Sturt Street is a busy main road. Dodds Street is a quieter main road.

Teachers should make themselves aware of the hazards associated with crossing roads, alighting from or boarding transport and ensure active supervision of students at all times.

It is recommended you arrive 10 minutes prior to your allocated booking time to allow time for bag cloaking.

Accessibility and Supervision

Care should be taken moving around the galleries. Teachers are responsible for the ongoing supervision of students at all times. Teachers in charge must carefully read and sign Group Visitation Guidelines at ACCA's Front Desk upon arrival. ACCA is fully wheelchair accessible.

Teachers should be aware of any medical concerns, support needs or behavioural concerns that may affect students and their participation in learning programs, and safe movement throughout the gallery. Should there be any specific supports or requirements, teachers are asked to notify ACCA Education before the group visits.

First Aid

ACCA has trained First Aid staff on hand. First aid kits are located in ACCA's offices, staff toilet and workshop. In the case of an emergency or severe medical issue the ACCA Front of House will contact the Ambulance for assessment and patient transfer where appropriate.

Where students have medical needs such as severe allergies or asthma, teachers or school support staff should always carry with them the required medication for the appropriate medical response.

Incident Reporting

ACCA is committed to maintaining a safe environment for our employees, contractors and visitors. We encourage incident reporting in order to identify and address hazards. If a student or teacher experiences a 'near miss' or an injury, we ask that the teacher in charge reports this to the ACCA Educator as soon as possible.

Emergencies

In the case of an emergency your ACCA Educator will advise and direct all visitors on appropriate action. Emergency alert and evacuation tone systems are in place at ACCA. The ACCA Educator will provide direction to the teacher in charge of the group and this person is responsible for ensuring compliance with the directions by all students.
